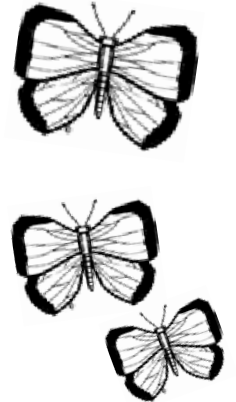

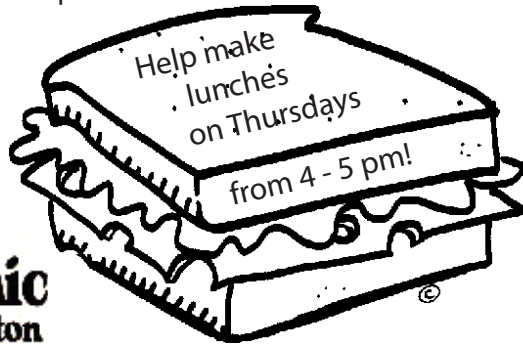

From RACHEL

My Dear Friends,

This is the last message I write to you as a staff member of Beautiful Savior. It's a melancholy experience for me. I've been packing up my office for the last few hours, and as I've sorted through things to save and things to throw away I've come across pictures, cards, permission slips, and other mementos that remind me of the wonderful three years I've spent with you all. I've been laughing and re-living memories of lock-ins, car-washes, beautiful worship services, dinners, sailing trips, camps, youth services, dinner club dates, Peace & Justice meetings, taking the high school youth to New Orleans, coordinating Vacation Bible School, playing kick-ball in the back field – the list goes on and on. I will carry these memories with me as I transition to the next phase of my life.

Even as I mourn leaving Beautiful Savior, I'm excited to head off to seminary at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. My mom and I leave on the 2000 mile car trip on August 21. We are planning to be touristy, making stops at Little Big Horn and Mt. Rushmore. My new roommates, Amy & Amy, called me the other day to say they had our apartment all set up and are anxious for me to move in. I've started a facebook group for entering seminarians and thus have 24 friends already! I'm looking forward to my fall classes, which will include Greek, Church History, Intro to Pastoral Care, and an elective. As soon as I get to school I will look for a very part-time job. Because of the generosity you all showed in supporting my scholarship fund, I will only need to work 10-15 hours a week. Thank you so much for that support. It means more to me than I can express in words.

It is not enough to simply thank you for the scholarship fund. I have to thank you for being a family to me these last three years. I have learned from you and grown a lot since I showed up in the middle of the summer of 2008. Navigating the waters of ministry at Beautiful Savior has given me great experiences to draw from when I finally am ordained and become a pastor in the ELCA. More than anything, thank you for loving me and engaging in the work of God with me. It's a great privilege to be part of a church family like this one. I will continue to be part of Beautiful Savior as a member. BSLC is my sponsoring congregation, and as such I am looking forward to staying in touch over the next four years. When I say goodbye on July 31st, it is only for a few months. I will be back December 18th to preach and give a report on my first semester of

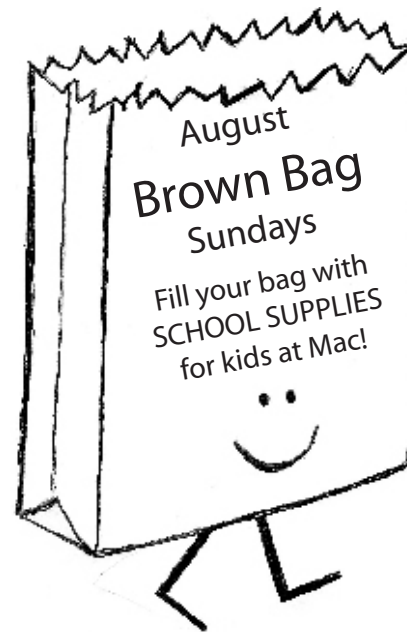

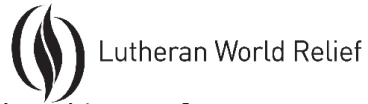

Gifts of Hope



Lutheran World Relief has a strong and long history of support at Beautiful Savior from our earliest days. When the role of our congregation was to sort and send used clothing and blankets, LWR was a subset of our Social Ministry program. However, LWR has evolved over time in our congregation and internationally.

About 18 years ago, BSLC women began meeting regularly to make quilts to add to our annual (sometimes semi-annual) shipment of used clothing. Then 15 years ago the group also began collecting items for health and school kits. 13 years ago we assembled our first sewing kits, and a year later began to create layettes.

This fall we plan to ship school kits, personal care kits, baby care kits and quilts.

When LWR eliminated the clothing collection, we transitioned, changing our focus to more quilts and kits, increasing the number of quilts we made in order to send some to Mexico with our house-building mission team each year. Under the guidance of our LWR team, many VBS children have made a quilt block as a service project.

At times the Sunday School children and Confirmation classes have participated by assembling kits and gathering kit items.

When we began assembling kits, our group moved out from under the auspices of Social Ministry and became a ministry program of its own, though Social Ministry continued to support our work by paying for the LWR semi-annual shipping fees to get our gathered items from Portland, OR to Baltimore, MD.

We are preparing for the Lutheran World Relief fall ingathering of kits and quilts. We have no budget for operating expenses and seek the support of the congregation to provide the items needed for kits. This fall we plan to ship school kits, personal care kits, baby care kits and quilts. Lutheran World Relief has recently changed the contents for all kits so please provide only the items on the lists which are posted on the BSLC bulletin board.

In the spirit of community, we want to know our church members a little better. Each month it may be an old or a new member, each chosen at random.

Finally, upon completion of the 2012 budget, the committee is charged with the task of preparing preliminary budgets for 2013, 2014 and 2015. This means looking ahead to staffing needs, program, maintenance, capital and reserve priorities to learn if and how each can be funded. It will likely require additional input from a variety of committees

Insurance Monitor --

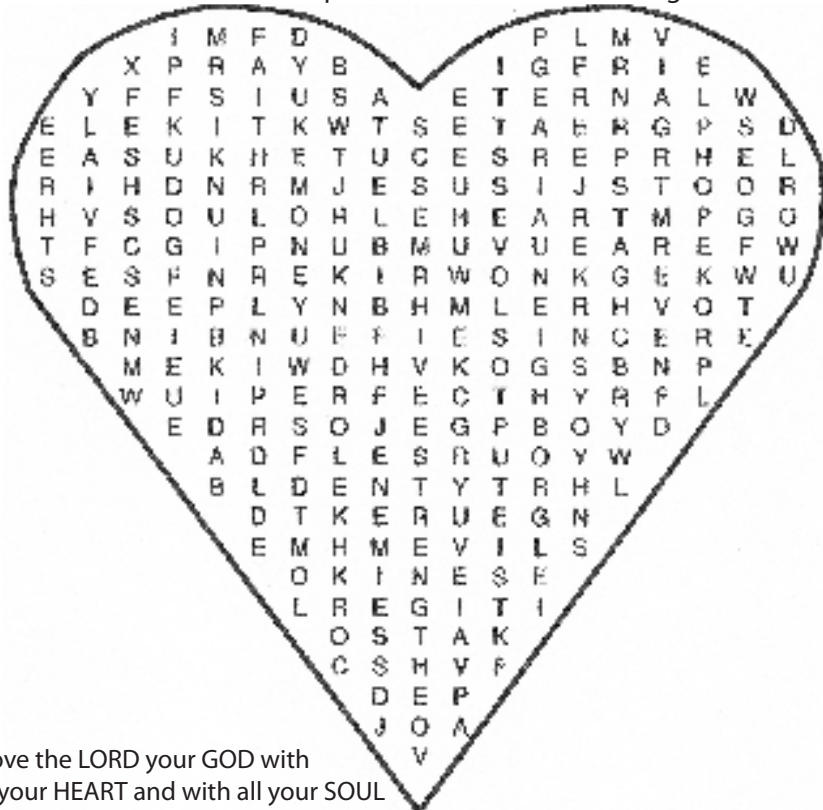

A planning group reviewed the potential number of students in different age groups, the building space we have to work with, curriculum, and volunteer needs.

BSLC has enough kids to support three classes:

Pre-school and Kindergarten; 1st and 2nd grades;
and 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades.

Three key goals for the Sunday School program are:

- ❖ Nurture each child's relationship with God and their understanding of how God helps us live as God's people in the world.
- ❖ Increase the number of BSLC kids attending Sunday School
- ❖ Coordination and teamwork between the volunteers and parents
